Information Order

GROUNDS FOR ISSUANCE

This Information Order is being issued under the authority of Section 77 of the *Environmental Management Act (EMA)*, SBC 2003, c.53 (the "Order"). The information required to be produced under this Order will be used for determining whether there are reasonable grounds for making a Pollution Prevention Order (*EMA* Section 81) or Pollution Abatement Order (*EMA* Section 83).

This order is issued as a result of actions or activities on or about the Deep Water Recovery Ltd. (DWR) facility located at 5084 Island Highway South, Union Bay which functions as a marine vessel dismantling and waste disposal operation (Facility). The Facility is located at 5084 Island Highway S., Union Bay, BC on the described land parcel:

PARCEL A (D.D. 27784N) OF LOT 11, NELSON DISTRICT, EXCEPT PARTS OUTLINED IN RED ON PLANS 397 R.W. AND 1414R, AND EXCEPT THOSE PARTS IN PLANS 7190, 8906, 21511, 22414, 28338, 29341, AND 29342

Ministry staff conducted an onsite inspection of the Facility on April 5, 2022 (IR 184988) and observed that it was composed of a mix of open gravel, beach front and asphalt pad. The asphalt area of the Facility is designed in such a way as it directs effluent from the Facility to three unlined collection basins. No treatment systems were observed connected to the unlined basins which drain directly to the marine environment.

Ministry staff conducted an onsite inspection of the Facility on August 17, 2022 (IR 193589) and observed that the wastes onsite included wood debris; steel scrap; unusable rusted material; septic system discharge; recreational vehicle effluent and surface water effluent. It was also confirmed at this time that there were no treatment systems connected to the unlined basins, which are designed to discharge directly to the marine environment when full.

Ministry staff conducted an onsite inspection of the Facility on October 27, 2022 (IR 199271), during a significant precipitation event in excess of 20 mm. Ministry staff observed an active discharge of effluent overflowing from two of the unlined basins into the tidal foreshore and marine environment. Ministry staff collected samples of the effluent discharging into the environment, which exceeded BC Water Quality Guidelines Aquatic Life - Marine (BCWQG) for total Copper, Lead, Zinc and Cadmium.

DWR does not currently have any authorization under the Environmental Management Act (EMA) to discharge waste into the environment from the Facility. However, on July 11, 2022, DWR applied for a new permit under EMA to discharge water from three settling ponds/sumps at a barge dismantling facility. (Job #416364). On November 24, 2022, the Ministry emailed DWR and provided the Application Instruction Document (AID), Information Requirements Table (IRT), and First Nation Consultation Spatial Overlay Engine (SOE) report for DWRs permit application. The status of DWRs permit application is 'Applicant Work Window' in which a methods package is due February 17, 2023. DWR's final application is due three months from the date of the approval of the methods package. However, before the Ministry makes a decision on this application, there may be discharges from the Facility impacting the receiving environment. The monitoring information required in this order will be used to determine whether there are reasonable grounds for making a Pollution Prevention Order or Pollution Abatement Order.

The sampling and monitoring plan must identify all current and potential sources of effluent discharged from the DWR site and potential contaminates of concern. The 'Sampling and Monitoring Plan' must include but not be limited to the following analysis | February 28, 2023 |
| | 5 day Biological Oxygen Demand Total Suspended Solids pH Total and Dissolved Metals Rainbow Trout 96 hour lethality test. | |

For the purposes of this Order, the following definition applies:

"Qualified Professional" means an applied scientist or technologist specializing in a particular applied science or technology, including agrology, biology, chemistry, engineering, geology or hydrogeology, who (a) is registered in British Columbia with the professional organization responsible for his or her area of expertise, acting under that professional association's code of ethics and subject to disciplinary action by that association, and (b) through suitable education, experience, accreditation and knowledge, may be reasonably relied on to provide advice within his or her area of expertise as it relates to this order, or (c) is approved by the Director.

DUTY TO COMPLY

The requirements above must be undertaken on or before the associated "Required By" date. Failure to comply with the requirements of this order is a contravention of the *Environmental Management Act* [SBC 2003, c.53] and may result in legal action. I direct your attention to Section 120(10) of the *Environmental Management Act*, which reads:

"(10) A person who contravenes an order...that is given, made or imposed under this Act by a ...director...commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding \$300 000 or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both."

Failure to comply with the requirements of this order may also result in an administrative penalty under the Administrative Penalties Regulation (*Environmental Management Act*) [B.C. Reg 133/2014] (Regulation). I direct your attention to Section 12(4) of the Regulation, which reads:

"(4) A person who fails to comply with an order under the [Environmental Management] Act is liable to an administrative penalty not exceeding \$40 000."

RIGHT TO APPEAL

This Order may be appealed to the Environmental Appeal Board in accordance with Part 8 of the *Environmental Management Act*. An appeal must be delivered within 30 days from the date that notice of this decision is given. For further information, contact the Environmental Appeal Board at 250-387-3464.
